Phikria Asanishvili, PhD. Is an Associate professor at Tbilisi State University (TSU). Faculty of Social and Political Sciences. Department of International Relations. Dr. Asanishvili earned her PhD in Political Sciences, Tbilisi State University. She works at Tbilisi State University since 2005 and is the head of the MA program of Eurasian and Caucasian Studies. From February 2021 Dr. Asanishvili became a director of the Department of International Relations, Faculty of Social and Political Sciences. She specializes in South Caucasus regional studies, EU's Eastern policy, NATO relations with South Caucasus Region, Black Sea security problems. Associate Professor Asanishvili publishes extensively on Security problems in South Caucasus region; NATO's interests in Black Sea; Conflicts in Caucasus. She has been invited in European Universities for delivering lectures about South Caucasus EU relations. Dr. Asanishvili actively takes part in international conferences and round tables on related topics.



Jānis Bērziņš, PhD, a senior researcher and previously the director of the Center for Security and Strategic Research (CSSR) at the National Defense Academy of Latvia, a non-resident researcher fellow and advisor at the Swedish Defence University, a senior fellow at Center for the Study of New Generation Warfare, and The Potomac Foundation. His work focuses on the juxtaposition between the theoretical developments of Russian Military Thought and the operational reality on the ground.



Savaş Biçer, (R) Colonel Dr. is Professor at Faculty of Business Social and Administrative Sciences University of ISTANBUL NISANTASI and lecturer at TURKISH NATIONAL DEFENCE UNIVERSITY, Turkey. He received B.A. in Economics in Turkish Military Academy in Ankara, M.A. in Turkish War College and PhD in Institute of social science, Political Science and International Relations Department, Istanbul YEDITEPE University. While worked as an active staff officer he was employed in various NATO Headquarters and participated in several Peace Support Operations such as UNPROFOR and SFOR in Bosnia-Herzegovina, KFOR in Kosovo and Macedonia, and ISAF in Afghanistan. He has five NATO and one United Nations Service Medals. He also worked as a head at the Defense Industry Foreign Relations Department at Turkish Ministry of Defense. His main fields of specialization are national security analysis, peace and conflict analysis, international terror, NATO, PfP, Peace Support Operations and NATO military interventions. He has written books and articles concerning these subjects.



Filip Bryjka, political scientist, PhD in security studies. Analyst at the Polish Institute of International Affairs (PISM). Assistant Professor at the Department of Security Studies in Military University of Land Forces (AWL). Specializes in the field of proxy wars, hybrid warfare and countering disinformation. Dr. Chitadze previously served as senior advisor on the National Security Council of Georgia and was Head of the Public Relations Division of the State Agency for Regulation of Oil and Gas Resources of Georgia. He has also held senior positions in the Department of Strategic and Military Policy at the Georgian Ministry of

Defense and foreign policy research and analysis center of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Georgia. Dr. Chitadze has received his educational credentials in Georgia (Tbilisi State University and Diplomatic Academy of Georgia) as well as several international higher educational institutions, including University of Oxford in the UK, George C. Marshall European College for Security Studies (Germany) and several other well-known European educational institutions. He is author of the about 280 researches/articles and six books on Geopolitics and International Relations.



Joe Davis, Major, began his career as an enlisted Psychological Operations Specialist with the United States Army. Early in his career, he enrolled in the Reserve Officer Training Corps with Missouri State University, where he earned a Bachelor's of Science in Psychology. Upon completion of college, he began a full-time career in the United States Army and an Infantry Officer and is a veteran of both the War in Afghanistan and Iraq. After serving for 10 years in the Infantry, he became an Information Operations Officer. Since the completion of his Information Operations training, he has been serving as the Subject Matter Expert for Simulated Media Operations at the Joint Force Training Centre in Bydgoszcz, Poland. Here, he is responsible for creating a

simulated environment that includes broadcast, digital, radio, print, and social media for NATO Training Exercises. His professional military education includes: Airborne School, Ranger School, Cavalry Leaders Course, Command and General Staff College, Red Team Members Course, Information Operations Qualification Course, and the Military Deception Planners Course.



Dirk Dubois, graduates from the Belgian Military Academy with a master degree in social and military science in 1985. In the first part of his career he occupies several operational posts, including abroad, and positions as a staff officer. Conflict Studies Working Group of the PfP Consortium of Defence Academies and Security Studies Institutes, the Friends of History Society, the Society of Military Historians and Military History Working Group, Society of Polish Geopolitics. 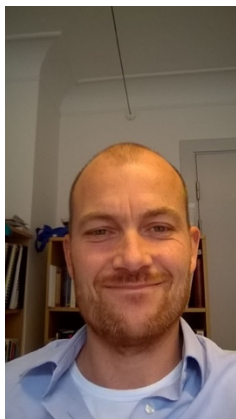

Coordinator of the Scientific and Educational cooperation with different academic and research institutions in Poland and Ukraine. Since April 2017, he is a member of the Public Council at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine.



Thomas Mandrup – PhD, an Extraordinary Associate Professor at Stellenbosch University, South Africa and Associate Professor at Royal Danish Defence College, Denmark. He has published articles and book chapters and co-edited several books on issues related to African security governance, climate security in Africa, Peacemissions and South African foreign policy. Currently, he is finalizing a monograph on the South African National Defence Force. He works as a consultant for Risk Intelligence on African Security. He received his PhD in International Relations (2007) from the University Copenhagen, Denmark for a dissertation entitled: *‘Africa: Salvation or Despair? Head of the Department of Public Policy and Administration at the Institute of Political Science, University of Gdańsk. A graduate of the Naval Academy and the University of Gdańsk. Currently employed at the Political Science Institute UG, in the past employed at the Command and Maritime Operations Department of the Naval Academy and Director of the Institute of Security and International Affairs at the Lower Silesian University. Editor-in-chief of the "Yearbook of International Security" and vice-president of the Polish Geopolitical Association. His main research interests include issues of the use of military potential in the politics of states, the political-military interaction of states and non-state actors in the sea basins, especially with regard to the Baltic Sea, and Russian energy policy as an instrument of political-economic expansion. In the recent period the author in co-authored monograph: *Russian Strategic Thought and Military Potential in the 21st Century, Russian Vision of Energy Power in the 21st Century and The Baltic Sea in Russia's Security Policy.*



Aleksandar Nacev - PhD is the Dean of the Faculty of Detectives and Criminalistics at the European University in Skopje. Zachary Paikin - Researcher in the EU Foreign Policy unit at CEPS. He is also a Nonresident Research Fellow with the Institute for Peace & Diplomacy in Toronto and a Senior Visiting Fellow at the Global Policy Institute in London. His academic research has focused on great power relations, Russian foreign policy and the future of international order. He has translated this into a policy focus on European and Eurasian political and security dynamics. In addition to authoring several peer-reviewed journal articles, his policy analyses have been published by think tanks including the European Council on Foreign Relations, the Royal United Services Institute, the Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung, the Fondation pour la recherche stratégique, LSE IDEAS, the Wilson Center's Kennan Institute, and the Russian International Affairs Council. Zachary

formed part of the Global Policy Institute's research team on Eurasian connectivity that partnered with Jawaharlal Nehru University as part of the EU-India Think Tank Twinning Initiative. While teaching international relations as an assistant lecturer at the University of Kent, he also served as a project affiliate with the H2020 UPTAKE inter-university consortium on Eastern European affairs and with the UK GCRF "COMPASS" network on post-Soviet governance. From 2017 to 2020, he was Senior Editor of Global Brief magazine. He was also a speechwriter at Canada's Permanent Mission to the United Nations as part of the Canadian government's bid for a UN Security Council seat in 2020. Zachary is also an affiliated expert with the Minsk Dialogue Council on International Relations, as well as a member of the Cooperative Security Initiative co-launched by GLOBSEC and the Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung's Regional Office for Cooperation and Peace in Europe (FES ROCPE). He is also part of FES ROCPE's "Fresh Look on Eastern European Trends" (FLEET) expert group, where he played a leading role in authoring the group's signature publication in 2020 entitled Responsible Europe. He is additionally a collaborator with the Network for Strategic Analysis, which forms part of the Mobilizing Insights in Defence and Security (MINDS) programme of the Department of National Defence of Canada. In 2021, Zachary was invited to join the European Leadership Network's Younger Generation Leaders Network on Euro-Atlantic Security (YGLN). He was named a GLOBSEC Young Leader in 2019.



Hryhorii Perepelytsia is the Professor of the Institute international relations at the Kiev National University and the Director of the Foreign Policy Research Institute. He is the Doctor of political sciences, the professor. He is known in Ukraine and abroad as the expert in the field of foreign and security policy, international conflict settlement and international military relations.
